Students may be identified as needing special education when a multidisciplinary evaluation determines that a student has a disability or meets the criteria for gifted ability and also needs specially designed instruction.

Embracing Each Student's Potential

Eligibility:

Students identified as eligible for special education in the Riverview School District are entitled to a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) available at no cost to the parents. Services designed to meet the needs of eligible students include the development of an Individualized Education Program (IEP) annually, re-evaluations every 2 years for students with an intellectual disability or 3 years for a student with other disabilities. Special Education Services may be provided in or outside of the regular education classroom in the student's neighborhood school. Some students will require special education services outside of a regular school. The decision about the type of services a student needs and location of these services is made by the IEP team, based on the comprehensive information regarding the student's needs, strengths, and chronological age. Some students may need related services to benefit from the educational program.
