Mrs. Poth recently submitted a proposal for a chapter in a book. That book, Snapshot in Education (2016), was recently published through Edumatch and is available on Amazon in various formats. Poth's chapter is included and is titled <u>Blended and Flipped Learning</u>. The chapter focuses on student voices.

Principal, Eric Hewitt, indicated that "Mrs. Poth is always looking for ways to provide new learning opportunities for our students and to become more connected as an educator". Topics include blended learning, STEM, student voice and choice, professional development, and personal learning networks (PLNs), among others. The book is available as a free PDF download on the EduMatch website, as well as in paperback and Kindle versions. EduMatch was established in September 2014. With a global reach of over 20,000, the project uses the power of social media to help foster collaboration and connections among educators around the world.
