8th Grade Student receives Luminari Award



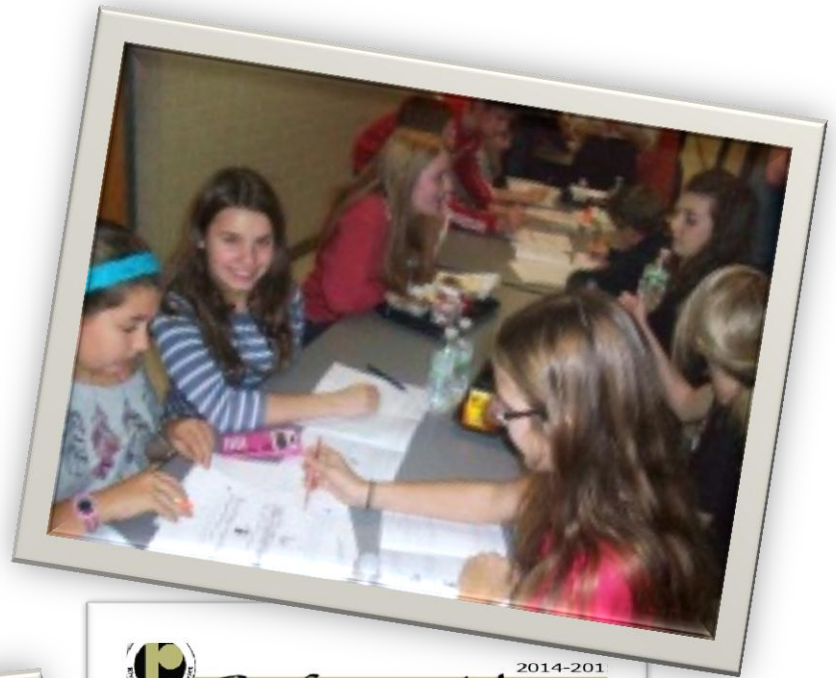

It's All About Safety

In 2014-2015, the Riverview School District will focus its safety efforts on reviewing, modifying, and adding to its Emergency Management Plan. The committee of District Administrators oversees this process. Over the past year, they have also been writing a supplement—an After Hours Plan—for emergencies that will occur after the official day has ended. This plan will cover athletic and extra-curricular events, community use of the building, and evening meetings and activities. This plan will also outline procedures to put in place to prevent emergency situations. The group looks to submit a draft of the plan to the school board in the spring.

In addition, the Emergency Management Committee continues to work through a checklist of items to improve or install in the various buildings. This list was comprised of the building audits completed by outside organizations. The

suggestions were organized into an implementation plan that spans several school years.

New for 2014-2015 is the Visitor Identification System. This system, implemented in all three building offices through a grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Education's "Safe Schools" Division, checks a visitor's identification against a database of offenders. An alert is sent to administrators for anyone who is flagged through the system. Procedures have been put in place for responses to these alerts.

A district-wide key swipe system is in place which provides an additional safety check of those entering the building.

The Emergency Management Plan continues to be updated, the support of parents and the community remains vitally important.

Our Plan

The Emergency Management Plan is part of a systematic effort on the part of the Riverview School District to provide for the care and well-being of its students and staff. The plan is continuously updated with information found through meet-

ings, outside presentations, and evaluations of crisis events.

This year, updates to the plan will include completing an addition that will outline after-school procedures. In addition, the District hopes to

Administrators continue to meet on a regular basis with local law enforcement, emergency management services, fire departments, and other organizations. These groups work hand-in-hand with the District to carry out and evaluate its plan. Meetings focus on protocols, changes/updates to emergency procedures, and how to further strengthen partnerships among the community responders and the District.

Personal Finance: Graduation Requirement Starting Next School Year



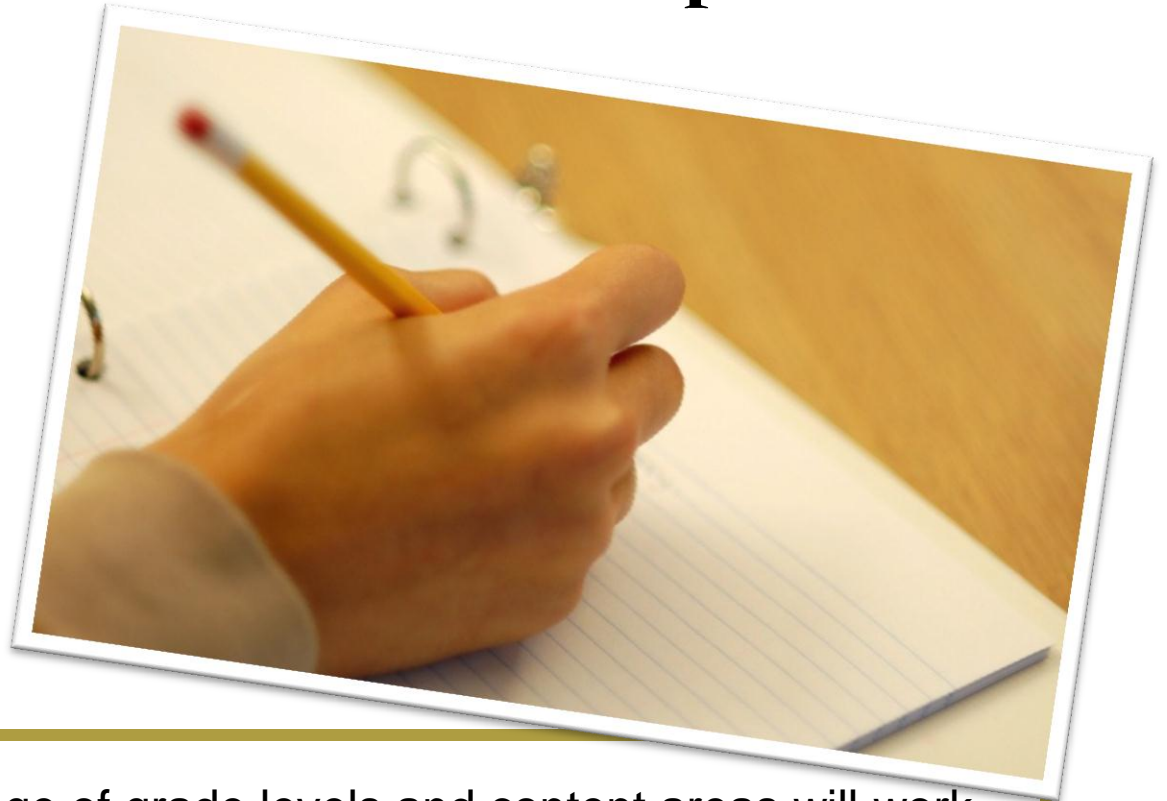
This one credit course will be open to students in Grades 9-12. The students will gain experience with a wide variety of topics, software and guest speakers.

New AP Statistics Course at Riverview High School



After much research, the Math Department decided to offer an AP Statistics course next year. The purpose of the AP course in Statistics is to introduce students to the major concepts and tools for collecting, analyzing and drawing conclusions from data. This course will replace the current Probability/Statistics II course.

K-12 Writing Framework Development



Teachers from a range of grade levels and content areas will work together over the next year to begin developing a comprehensive K-12 Writing Framework that will guide students' learning of written communication across the disciplines. Students will learn locally-developed, universal writing strategies for writing a lab report, a persuasive essay, or a narrative artist statement.

As we begin the final phase of the 21st Century Learning and Mentoring Class, we will be integrating the English curriculum to help the 7th grade students immerse themselves in the learning of Greek mythology.



Foreign Languages: Elementary Outreach Program

This program is designed to extend the study of French and Spanish to the Tenth Street and Verner Elementary Schools. 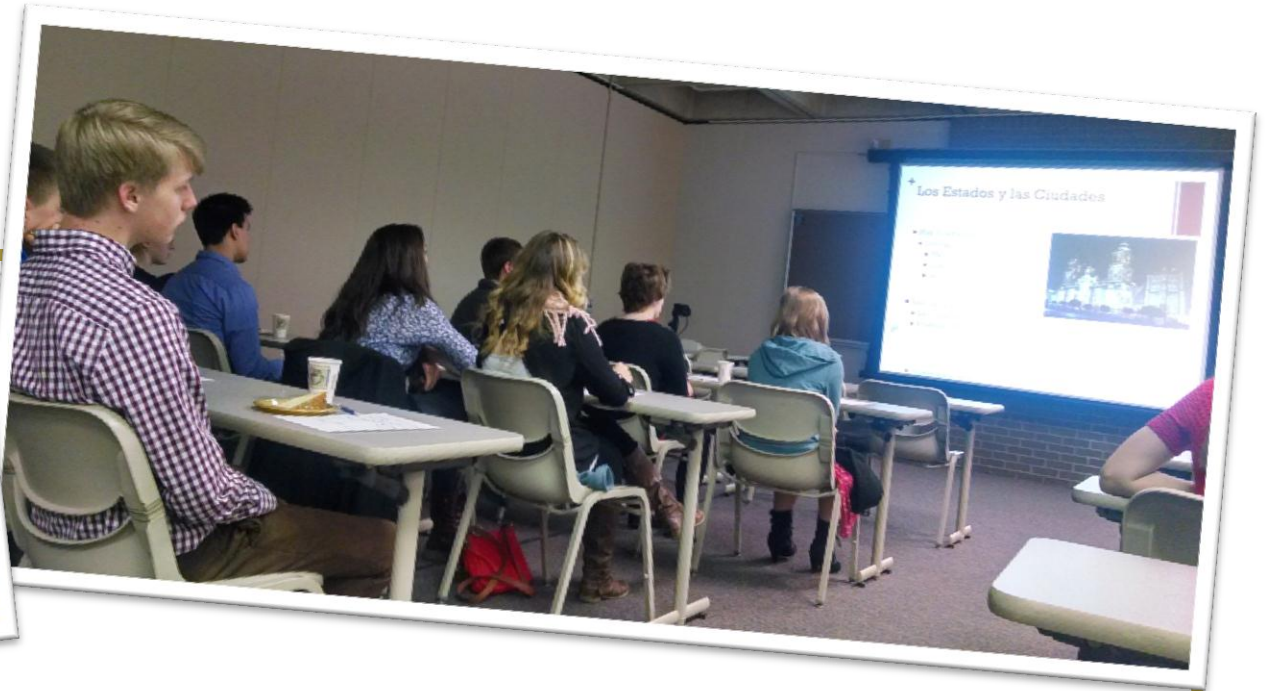

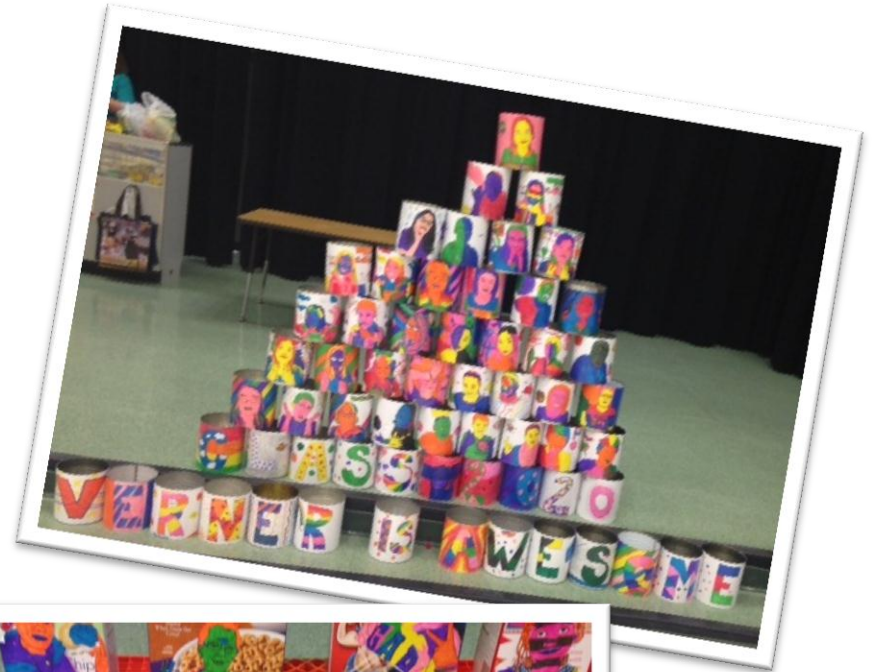


Riverview Jr/Sr High School performs Fiddler on the Roof
