## Monitoring Student Learning

December is a great month for teachers to assess student progress and compare it to benchmark data taken at the beginning of the year. Recognizing skills students have mastered and where additional remediation is needed assists with creating a plan to assist students with learning and meeting academic goals during the second half of the school year. # Unplanned or Weather Delays and Closings

When it becomes necessary to close school due to inclement weather or other emergencies, the following television stations and sources will be contacted: KDKA, WPXI, WTAE Web: <u>www.rsd.k12.pa.us</u> and a School District messenger phone call.

The delay of school is primarily intended to accommodate students walking to school and other transportation needs. Staff members are asked to report at the regular time, but are urged to use caution in driving over snow and ice covered roads. The safety of our students and staff is important to us. I ask that you consider this upon sending your children to school in the morning, entering your automobile, or heading out on a snowy winter morning. I prefer that you take your time and arrive safely. Parents always have the option of keeping their children at home in the event of unsafe conditions.

Any early dismissal decisions relate mostly to our youngest students. We prefer not to risk sending primary students home to a potentially empty house. As a result, early dismissals are typically avoided. However, parents always have the option to pick their child up at school.
