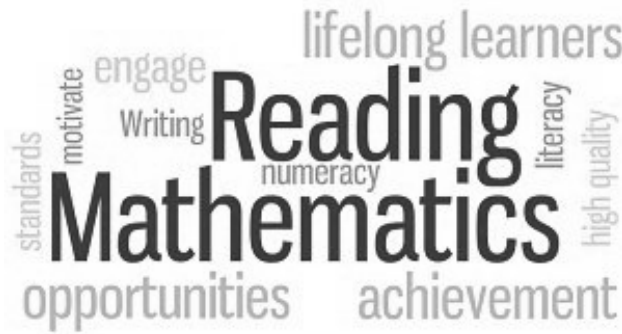

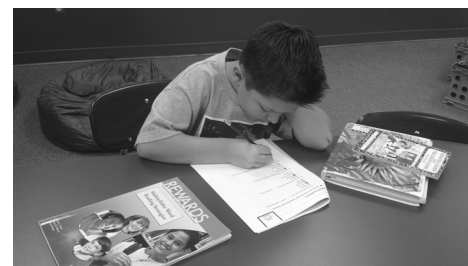
The Title I Program

This federally funded program provides additional opportunities for students to acquire the skills outlined in Pennsylvania's Academic Standards that all students are required to meet. Selection of students to participate in the Title I program is determined by student performance on grade level diagnostic assessments and classroom teacher recommendations.

Title I services include additional instruction supplementing what is offered in the regular classroom to ensure that all children will be successful.
