PSSA Writing and Science Data Review

• Graduation Requirements/Keystone Examinations

Mrs. Black reviewed PDE's recently released Keystone Examination requirements. Students in the classes of 2015 and 2016 will be required to take Keystone Exams in English Literature, English Composition, Algebra I and Biology. Beginning with the class of 2017 (current 6th graders), students will be required to take 6 Exams selected from 2 English, 2 Math, 1 Science and 1 Social Studies. RSD is participating in November electronic field tests for Keystones in Algebra I, Biology and English Literature in order to "preview" exam formats and to test the district's abilityto support electronic exam administration.

Mr. Moser, Mr. Hadley and Mrs. Black have discussed Keystone graduation requirements with Dr. Erdeljac and are recommending the use of Keystones as a graduation requirement without the 1/3 final course grade stipulation. This is the option being chosen by most of our neighboring districts. The recommendation will be taken to the Board in January. Mrs. Black also shared the website http://video.paiunet.org as a good source of graduation/Keystone information.
