Good afternoon! We hope you are well.

Now that we have a full week of school under our belts, we wanted to reach out with a few additional reminders:

- Emergencies/Communication In addition to causing damage to basements and homes this week, the hurricane Ida storm wreaked havoc on student transportation across the County. In an emergency, please know that we are feverishly working behind the scenes to solve problems, receive and respond to real time information from the bus garage, and simultaneously relay reliable communication out to the public. The goal is to keep everyone safe. We will always do our best to answer calls and respond promptly, but please be patient, check the website, and know that information will be released as soon as possible. We are continuously searching for more efficient ways to disseminate information, and we appreciate your understanding and support.
- <u>Mask Order</u> As you know, a universal mask mandate has been in place here at Riverview for quite some time. However, on September 7th, the Governor and the State Department of Health have issued its own mask mandate for schools. The order doesn't really affect us, but some parents have asked if the guidance regarding masks has changed (recommendations, styles, research, etc.).
