Making the Movie:

1. If students have iPhones and know how to use iMovie, they may make and edit the movie and submit it
2. If students have Movie Maker and know how to use it they may edit their movie and submit it.
3. If students do not have a movie editing program or know how to use it, they can simple film each scene separately on their phones and then submit each scene to me

*** It is important, that students understand they do not need to upload an app or learn an app, I am perfectly comfortable with a simple set of scenes that student make and send me.

Submitting the Movie:

1. If a student is able they can upload the movie into TEAMS
2. If a student is unable to upload the movie to TEAMS they can attach it to an email and email it to me (Mr. Carlin- mcarlin@rsd.k12.pa.us).
