Since the lesson review sheets and handouts are the only graded assessments for the chapters, I fully expect your individual best efforts in addressing each question with thoughtful, complete answers in order to earn full credit. (Rarely are a few words or one sentence considered a complete answer.)

You were to start a journal beginning Monday, April 6, to record the ECONOMIC affects you are witnessing. It could be from a news report on TV, an account or observation of what a specific business or worker (essential or not) is experiencing, etc. A minimum of three different reflections per week. The entries need only to be a short paragraph (3-5 sentences) with a notation of the date and source of the information. Remember, these entries **MUST** relate to economics! You will be asked to submit these journal entries once every 2 weeks. The next due date for 6 entries is Friday, May 1.
