### RHS Students See Increase in Test Scores

Great news for Riverview students taking the AP exam! AP, or Advanced Placement courses, prepare students for the next level with increased rigor and a college-like academic experience. Students who score a 3 (qualified), 4 (well qualified), or 5 (extremely well qualified) on the AP exam, can earn college credit. The number of students scoring a 3, 4, or 5 increased by 10% from 2014 to 2015!

Our underclassmen also saw some significant increases on the Keystone exams. Students in grades 7-10 take the Algebra I exam after they complete the course. Because of their hard work, we saw growth of 10% in Advanced and Proficient scores. Even more impressive, we had growth of 17% in Advanced scores! Not to be left out, the Biology students grew their Advanced and Proficient scores by 7%.
