Instructions

- 3) You will be acting as the leaders of the 4 countries actually invited to this conference (Paris Peace Conference). Keep the questions from page 1 in your mind at all times as you try to make a decision.
- 4) Read the points of all 4 leaders (USA, Great Britain, France, and Italy) found on pages 3-7 of the packet. As you read, determine who would side with whom and why.
- 5) After reading the points of view of the 4 leaders, look at the options for each issue on packet pages 8-9.
 - a. Determine what option would be chosen for each area of concern and why. - 6) Summary Consider what you know about the war. Type/Write a 1-2 page summary discussing if you believe this treaty would actually work? Consider the following questions:
 - a. Why would this treat succeed/fail?
 - b. What information was left out of the treaty?
 - c. Were the correct people/countries invited to this conference?
 - d. What do you think will happen in the next 10 years because of this treaty?
