ILLUSTRATED NAMES:

Step 1- Draw the letters of your name using **Bubble letters**, **Block letters** or **Fancy Letters**.

(See video under Buncee tab on our Team page for an easy way to draw bubble and block letters)

Step 2- Fill your empty letters with pictures, patterns and/or designs. Each letter can be different or fit a theme.

Step 3- Color your creation using whatever materials you have at home. Colored pencils should be your first choice to show all the details but crayons and markers will also work. If you prefer “black and white”, pencil only will work.

Just be sure to show multiple grays by pressing harder or softer on the pencil.

For example: your favorite color, place, season, cartoon, animal, car, candy, food, activity, hobby and/or sport, etc.

RECIPES IN ART START WITH THE ELEMENTS- LINE :

Step 1- Using pencil or markers, draw a series of lines that are parallel to each other and change directions multiple times.

(See the sample below left)

Step 2- Fill an entire page with your design.

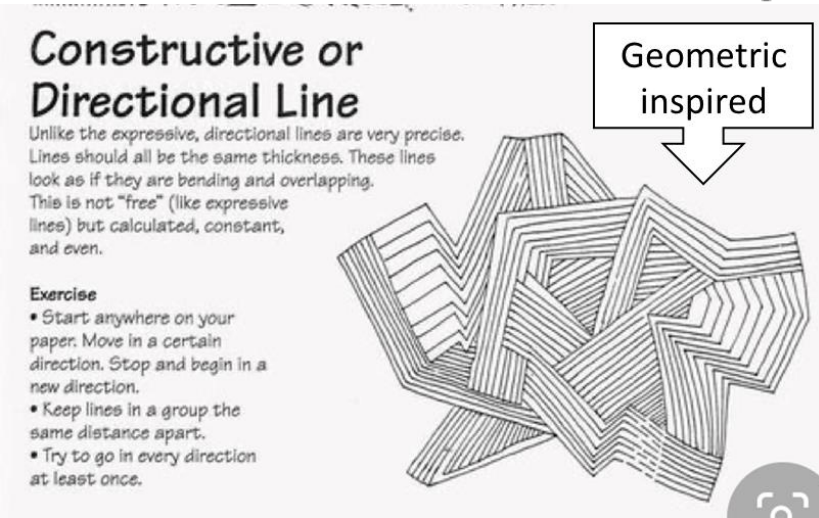
Step 3- Using pencil or markers, draw a series of lines that are expressive...lines should vary in look, thickness, length, etc.

(see the sample below right)

Step 4- Fill an entire page at least 8.5 x 11" with your design.
