LIFE provides the student an opportunity to create an individual life plan in an authentic learning environment that supports a partnership between the student, community, family and educators. The program is a resource to the school districts and parents as they look for programming that will meet the needs of students that have completed their senior year in high school; bridging the gap into active participation in the adult world.

LIFE Program Vision

The program is committed to a partnership between the school, student, family, and community agencies. Relationships with vital agencies that can support the student beyond the public educational setting will be developed. The outcome for each student is preparation for the adult world with a clear vision of what the future after public school will look like. Before exiting LIFE each student will have created a plan for the future.

Program Description

The LIFE Program is designed for 18-21 year old special needs students with disabilities who have banked their diploma to continue their education in the public school system. The program will provide intense transition experiences and training in real life settings with ongoing assessments. The LIFE Program is located in a house in the community and follows a curriculum that focuses on the three domains of transition: Post-secondary education, employment and independent living.

Curriculum

Based on the AIU Framework for Independent Living which is aligned with the Pennsylvania Academic Standards. The following domains are included:

- Home Living Skills
- Budgeting
- Safety & First Aide
- Community Living
- Vocational Opportunities
- Social Skills

Assessment

Students are assessed quarterly on progress in each domain as well as on work attitudes, behavior, occupational skills, work adjustments, job skills, travel, independence, and employment readiness.
