- Phonemic Awareness (oral activities): Syllable clapping- Have your child repeat each word back to you, clapping each syllable. They should be able to tell you how many syllables are in each word. They sometimes get confused between the number of sounds in a word and the number of syllables. Remind them that syllables are chunks in words that might have more than one sound. animal (3), bird (1), acrobat (3), caterpillar (4), book (1), buffalo (3), rainbow (2), table (2), bumblebee (3), combination (4), carefully (3), bike (1), conversation (4), flamingo (3), stop (1), eagle (2)

  Continue this with any words that you want to use!
- Word Building: Use letter cards to have children first read, then spell the words below. Your child can make the letter cards, or you can visit the RSD Literacy website for printable cards. Please do one lesson each of the three days.
