On Wednesday, April 1, Riverview students and staff had the opportunity to meet with representatives from China who are in the country to gain insight into how the United States educates students with Autism. The government of China selected four distinguished educators to come to the US to participate in training in an effort to bring applied behavior analytic (ABA) instruction and services to children with autism in their country. One element of the training will include having the trainees participate in a clinic to work on these skills with children. Another element will be to have these reps meet with American educators and children to ascertain knowledge into our educational system. Educators spent the day talking with Ms. Tiffany Nix, High School Principal, about our educational programs pertaining to special education. They also spent time with Frankie Principe, Mr. Slencak, and Mrs. Garland, student and Special Ed teachers discussing autism support and programming.
