Over the weekend of January 12-15, 2017, six Riverview students competed at the 16th annual Columbia University Model United Nations Conference and Exposition. The team of Dana Grover, Danielle Hanlon, Lena Ison, Emma Patterson, Liam Gaynor, and Calvin Hogate spent the weekend debating and negotiating with approximately 750 students from 5 different continents. The Columbia conference, which is one of the most difficult to gain entry into, filling its delegation registration allotment in less than 8 hours, provides delegates with a unique experience. While at the conference, students "live" in the city while taking the subway to the Columbia campus for sessions. Also while at the conference, the students had an opportunity to meet with an actual United Nations delegate from the Permanent Mission of the Holy See.
