The conference presented students the opportunity to debate in one of 6 committee rooms focusing on topics ranging from weaponization to the economic crisis in Venezuela. Members of the Riverview team played an integral role in each debate and were rewarded for their dedication. Winning awards for their performance at the conference were:
