Riverview Wins Awards at Johns Hopkins Model UN



From February 19-22, 8 Riverview students joined over 2000 students at the 19th annual Johns Hopkins University Model United Nations Conference. Riverview students participated in many discussions focusing on world issues. Some of the topics debated at the conference were how to solve the problems in Saudi Arabia, settle the dispute over the sovereignty of Hong Kong, the plight of women in developing nations, and the hypothetical death of Vladimir Putin. After all of the debate was completed, four Riverview students walked away with awards for the following roles:

Alexa Patsey, Second Place Outstanding Delegate for her role as the Russian Federation in the United Nations Security Council

These four awards bring the team total to 18 for this 2015-2016 season. The Model United Nations team is now looking forward to its final two events of the year, the non-competitive Model African Union and the annual competitive Westminster College Model United Nations Conference.
