In recognition of Veterans Day, teachers and students across the district will participate in a variety of activities. At the elementary school level, our students will be studying and learning about the heroic and selfless acts of these fine men and women. Kindergarten students will be reading and discussing an interactive "Happy Veterans Day - Let's Find Out" article and watching a short video on the topic. Many of our elementary school students will participate in age appropriate activities including reading books, reading poems, completing word tracings and coloring pictures associated with understanding the importance of our veterans.

At the JSHS, the Family and Consumer Science department made pumpkin cookies for the veterans while Key Club student members played bingo with veterans at the Veteran's Administration.
