Educators From Across Pennsylvania Participate in Keystone Technology Innovators Summit

From July 21 - 25, 2014, one hundred educators from across Pennsylvania were selected to participate in the Keystone Technology Innovators (KTI) Summit on the campus of Kutztown University. Selected for providing transformative classroom experiences to their students, Rachelle Poth represented the Riverview School District at this event.

At the summit, these innovative educators came together to collaborate and learn from one another along with a team of volunteer staff members who were previous Summit attendees themselves.
