-Meeting was called to order at 6:36pm. The board succession plan was discussed. Volunteers are needed to replace all board members for next year. Please consider volunteering for one of these very rewarding positions.

UPDATES

- -Mr. Hewitt discussed drop off in the mornings. They are continuously working with the Food Truck administrators to keep the large truck out of the way so people can drive around the building to drop off. We will be getting a removable "gate" that will soon block the Third street turn around. Someone will have to go out every morning and set it up and remove it after school has started. We discussed the dangers and other possible plans that PennDot has for that area/intersection.
- -H. Deem asked about the school entrance and if there was something we could to do to spruce it up a bit, update artwork, etc.... Mr. Hewitt mentioned that some construction is planned for the front entrance. A wall will be built down the center of the room and one way will be for entering the building and one to exit. Mr. Hewitt also discussed some possible Gym improvements in the works.
- -At the last meeting we discussed a possible student store that could have examples of what is available through our online spirit store. We used to have a student store that was run by the Student Council and Mrs. Walsh but is no longer. Mrs. Polsiak said that it would benefit the kids greatly to get them involved in reviving it. She gave FC school district examples. Could we have a cart that could be rolled out at events and during the day? Mr. MacConnell discussed maybe his kids could get involved. He mentioned the success of their plant sales. Mr. Hewitt mentioned that his office plant is now dead because Mrs. Zatawski is no longer there to water it.
- -Mr. Hewitt discussed other visible changes for the school in the works but no details given. There is a lot in the planning stages.
- -Mrs. Migely asked what ever happened to the school's Athletic Scholars. One or Two students were selected monthly for feature on the schools social media and website. Sometimes given a t-shirt as a reward for maintaining great grades while being involved in sports. This hasn't happened in quite awhile. Mr. Hewitt wasn't sure and it was decided that she should ask our Athletic Director if that was something he would revive?? Mrs. Migely also asked if it was the school that contacted the local paper or AKValley with student athlete features. Mr. Hewitt said it was not the school.
- -Mrs. Longstreth asked about the speaker issues in the gym. He said they are working on fixing that issue along with other gym improvements. He said that the band, portable speakers work great and can be used in a pinch. The school uses them for outdoor graduation.
