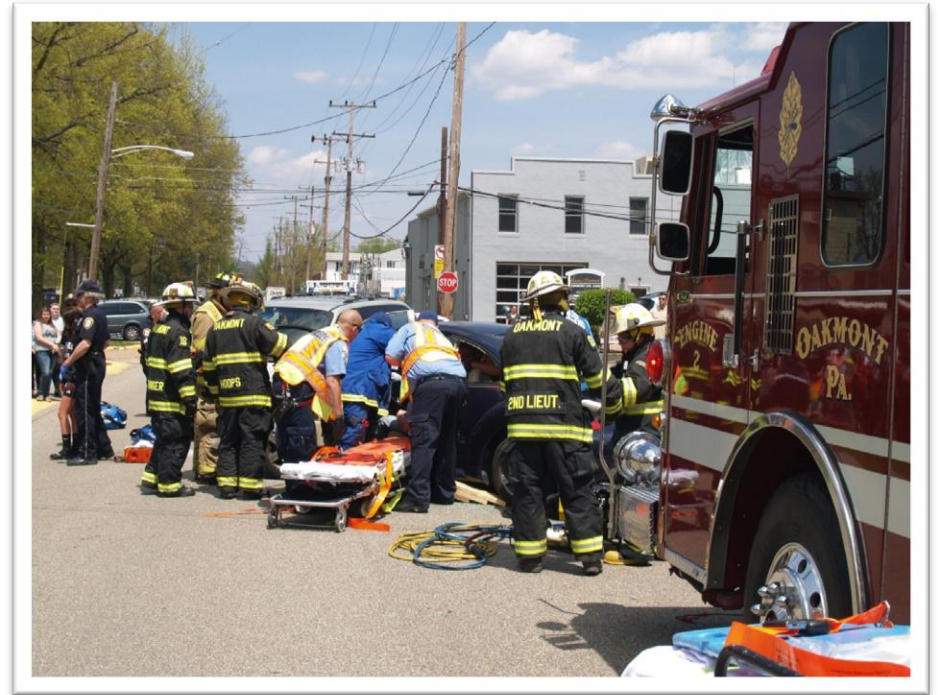

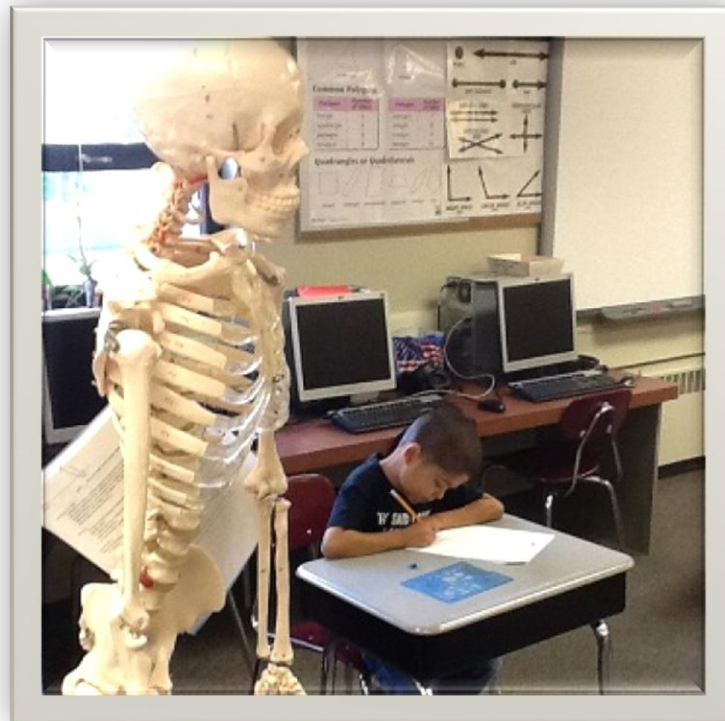

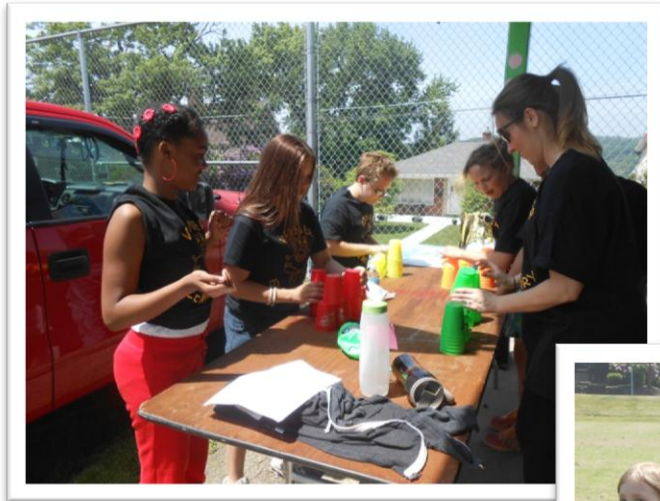
Students spend the day at Riverside Park participating in team activities, team sports and enjoying lunch.

Sochi Gold Medalist and Para Olympian visits 10th Street



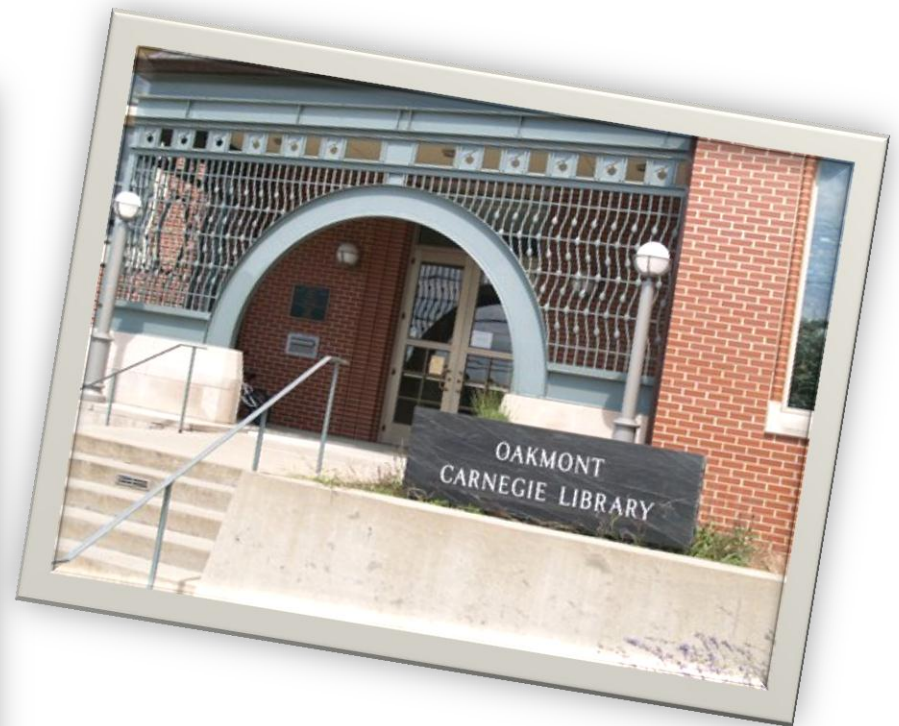

May was a Month of Music

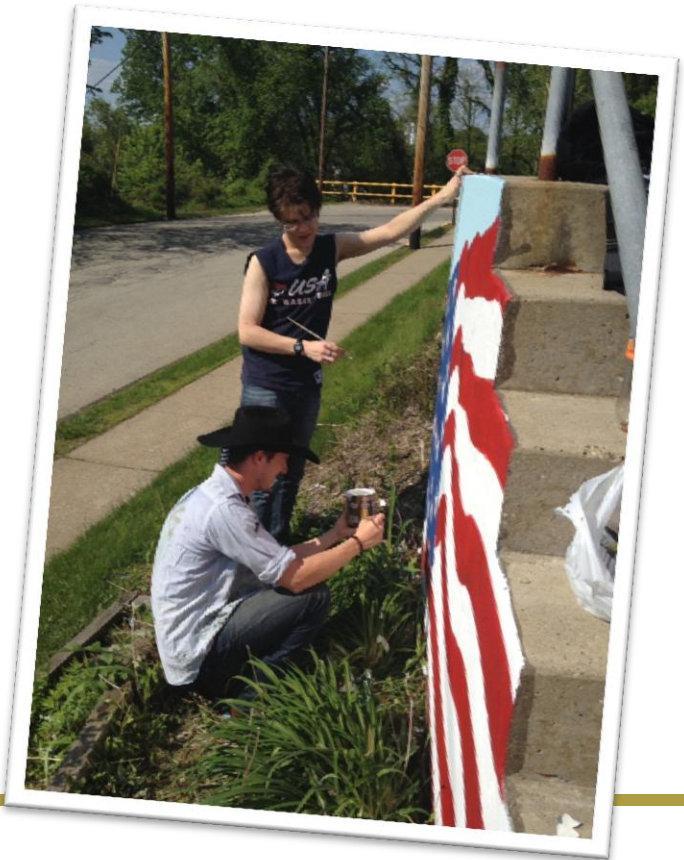
