Monitoring Student Learning

December is a great month for teachers to assess student progress and compare it to benchmark data collected at the beginning of the school year. Recognizing skills students have mastered and where additional remediation is needed assists with creating a plan to support student learning and meet academic goals during the second half of the school year. If you feel that your child has a particular need, please be sure to contact your child's teacher. A strong partnership between parents and teachers is important to student success.

LEARNING GOALS

Our teachers write a student friendly learning goal and refer to that goal at the beginning and end of every lesson. Research supports this practice. It is wonderful to walk into a classroom where children can tell you exactly what they are learning and what they hope to accomplish by the end of the period. Goals focus on concepts associated with the PA Common Core. We encourage parents to take some time to ask your child about what they learn in school and why they are learning it.
