PA Common Core

Teachers are reminded to revisit the PA Core standards and anchors related to their students. An awareness and understanding of the specific standards and grade level anchors is essential to setting classroom goals and providing our students with appropriate instruction at each grade level. We will continue to focus as much time as possible on our PD days to align our curriculum to the PA Common Core across grade levels.

Student Friendly Learning Objectives

Teachers are reminded to write and refer to student friendly learning goals at the beginning and end of every lesson. Research supports this practice. Take some time to ask your children about these learning goals. Goals should be aligned with relevant PA Common Core anchors and student needs.

Achievement and Growth

PSSA scores can assist us with measuring student achievement towards mastery of PA COMMON CORE standards at each grade level.

PVAAS data can assist us with measuring how much a student has grown academically over the course of one year.

BOTH data sources provide us with valuable information that can be used to assist teachers with making quality instructional decisions to meet the changing needs of our students.

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PVAAS data can assist us with determining our students' current abilities so that we can make researchbased instructional decisions to best support their needs.

Instructional Resources

It is important to remember that the textbook selected and provided to teachers is not our curriculum. The textbook is a foundational resource that should be supplemented as needed by teachers who make quality, research-based instructional decisions in order to assist our students with mastering the PA Common Core standards/anchors AND **BEYOND.** Please contact your building principal to assist you if you have questions or concerns about the resources you need to accomplish this goal.
