Support your response with specific details to defend why you either liked or disliked the article or video. I will ask you to submit your response to this write-to-think prompt on Monday, May 18th. Your response should be at least 4-5 sentences in length (a well-developed paragraph).

Academic English 10 (Periods 5 & 9) May 11-15, 2020

May 11: If you have not yet submitted the Chapters 22-31 Study Guide from the *To Kill A Mockingbird* Unit, please send it to me today. We are going to begin a new unit to utilize all of the literary terms we have studied this year in Academic English 10. This unit will be a Short Story and Literary Terms Review Unit. Today, I am asking you to respond to this Write-to-Think Prompt – Please write your own definition of FATE. Do you believe in fate or do you believe in free will? Support your response with specific details to defend your position. I will ask you to submit your response to this write-to-think prompt on Friday, May 15th. Your response should be at least 4-5 sentences in length (a well-developed paragraph).

May 12: Please begin reading the short story "The Fatalist." I am including a link for this short story. I am asking to finish reading this short story by Thursday, May 14th. Please preview the study guide questions at the end of the story. Here is the link for this short story:

May 14: Please finish reading the short story "The Fatalist" for today lesson. If you have not complete the Write-to-Think prompt from Monday's lesson, please finish it today.

May 15: Please submit the Write-to-Think Prompt from Monday's lesson. This is the only assignment I am collecting this week.

Speech 7 (Periods 2 & 4) May 11-15, 2020

Note for all Speech 7 Students:

I am hoping to do one of three things with this speech.

1. If possible, I am hoping that students can either create a voice memo or a video and then send it to me as an attachment to an email.

2. If a student is not able to send a voice memo or video, then he/she can give the speech in front of their family members and write a summary of how well he/she did on the presentation (1 well developed paragraph of at least 4-5 sentences).

3. I am looking into the possibility of creating a Team Meeting where a student can present his/her speech "live" in a virtual meeting.

Please let me know if you have any questions. I won't be asking students to submit one of the three presentation options until at least May 18th because I am going to give everyone a week to practice their speeches.

May 11: If you have not yet submitted the rough draft of your Perseverance Speech, please do so today. Please begin editing/proofreading the final draft of the speech. I will ask you to submit the final draft of your speech on Wednesday, May 13th. This will be the only assignment that I am collecting this week.

May 12: Please be sure to time your speech presentation and continue to edit the final draft of your speech.

May 13: Please submit the final draft of your speech today. Please begin the note cards for the speech. If you do not have note cards at home, you can use your notebook to write your "note cards." Remember to only write the main points for each section of the speech (and do not write complete sentences unless you are using a direct quote.) These note cards are for you. I will not be collecting them.

May 14: Please practice your speech using the note cards you created yesterday.

May 15: Please continue to practice your speech presentations. I will be asking students to submit their presentations next week.
