First Annual STEAM Showcase

On Thursday, January 13, 2016, over one-hundred community members, parents, students, and teachers attended Riverview Junior Senior High School's first STEAM Showcase. The evening celebrated the district's commitment to STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) education. Students in the junior high displayed projects they created in STEAM Across the Curriculum, a new course created with funding from a \$20,000 grant from the Center for Creativity. Projects included iMovies, Hummingbird Robots, MaKey MaKey, and K'Nex bridges. In addition to our junior high program, high school students shared their projects. Technology tools used by students in the school's Spanish classes and their projects were also on display. Students in Tech Ed displayed items designed and created on one of the district's two 3D printers. RVTV shared clips from The Current, the school's daily in-house news program, along with a variety of short skits the students have created. The Current took on a new face this year and makes use of developing students skills in media, technology, planning, writing, creativity, and language arts. Student artwork was on display and the yearbook staff was there to provide a sneak peek at pictures in this year's book. REAP (Riverview Enrichment Activities Program) students exhibited their creations from a variety of competitions. Guests were also invited to see programs coded by our students and take tours of the recent renovations. Life Skills Grant Awarded to Riverview

Riverview School District has been awarded a three year grant to implement LifeSkills Training to all students in grades 6-8. LifeSkills Training (LST) is a school-based program that aims to prevent alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana use and violence by targeting the major social and psychological factors that promote the initiation of substance use and other risky behaviors. LST is based on both the social influence and competence enhancement models of prevention. Consistent with this theoretical framework, LST addresses multiple risk and protective factors and teaches personal and social skills that build resilience and help youth navigate developmental tasks, including the skills necessary to understand and resist pro-drug influences. LST is designed to provide information relevant to the important life transitions that adolescents and young teens face, using culturally sensitive and developmentally and age-appropriate language and content, facilitated discussion, structured small group activities, and role-playing scenarios are used to stimulate participation and promote the acquisition of skills. This three year grant is valued at \$40,000.

The University of Pittsburgh students were also treated to an informal luncheon hosted by the Junior Senior High School. Several University students indicated that they were in awe of the experiences that the district provides to students as they watched students in a band class, visited a consumer science class, and enjoyed elementary students performing a song for the visitors on xylophones. At the same time, many RSD students were fascinated by the differences in educational format and delivery in the visitors' countries.

Riverview School Board President Honored

Associate Professor and Riverview Board President, Dr. Maureen McClure, has been named as a National Education Finance Conference (NEFC) Distinguished Fellow. The honor is one of the highest recognitions in the field of education finance. Dr. McClure will be honored during the National Education Finance Conference, occurring February 10-12, 2016, in Jacksonville, FL.

Dr. McClure is a senior researcher in the Institute for International Studies in Education (IISE) as well as former chair in the Department of Administrative and Policy Studies at the University of Pittsburgh School of Education. She teaches courses in fiscal and strategic management, education and development debates, and international and global education. Her research focuses on education in the generational interest.

Each year, the NEFC Distinguished Research & Practice Fellow Awards committee extends its award to 10 individuals who have gained national visibility by their "exemplary research and/or practice in the field of public education finance both on the elementary and secondary level as well as in higher education." The next year's committee is then drawn from past recipients.

Dr McClure has served on the Riverview School District board for the last 4 years and now serves as the president. The District is proud of her accomplishments and appreciative of the service she provides to the students of Oakmont and Verona.
