RIVERVIEW APPOINTS NEW ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

From May to June he will work with current longtime Riverview Athletic Director Mr. Bob Kariotis, who retires on June 30th. Sadie Buchser Becomes 1st RHS Cager Classic MVP! Riverview's Sadie Buchser knows what it's like playing against top-notch talent.

This past season, her Raiders played 21 of 25 of their games against playoff teams. So playing against tough competition came naturally to the senior as she was named East MVP in a 68-63 victory over the West in the 20th annual Cager Classic all-star event at Highlands. Buchser had 14 points,

five rebounds and two key steals Saturday night. "We definitely played the top teams, especially in the section with North (Catholic) and Vincentian," Buchser said. "Tonight was still a little different than playing them. It's fun to play against great competition."

The East took an 11-9 lead in the all-time series in what proved to be one of the most closely contested games. After the East took a quick 9-2 lead, neither team had more than a four-point lead until Buchser hit a free throw with 3:21 left, then made a 12-foot jumper to make it 68-61.

"It was really fun getting the opportunity to play. It was definitely different from school ball," Buchser said. "It was really fun to be out there with them.' Buchser is headed for Thiel College in Mercer County and is hoping to play basketball and softball if they mesh well with her academic load.

Thirty Riverview students competed against 8 other schools and approximately 150 students in the annual National History Day regional finals at the Senator John Heinz History Center. Students who participate in the National History Day competition can compete in one of five categories (exhibits, website creation, documen-

The EuroChallenge Competition is a national event that asks students to learn and explain economic concepts such as inflation, Gross Domestic Product, and unemployment and apply these concepts in order to propose a viable solution for an issue facing

one of the nations in the Eurozone. The team of Kalen Crowell, Veronica Gibson, and Louisa Miguez chose to research the problem of population decline in Latvia. After some initial research the team realized that there were many problems connected with population decline in Latvia. The team then created an elaborate plan to reallocate resources in order to improve education and focus on retaining educated youth in Latvia. The Riverview team finished second in this competition and was told by the judges that they had "set the bar high" and left "no need for questions" at the end of their presentation. While the team fell short of its goal of competing in the national finals in New York City, they became the highest finishing Riverview team ever in this competition and created a plan that could actually help Latvia in its quest to reverse its population decline.
